The Zebrure:

A unique feature necessary on a tread

A vehicle is charged with static electricity and must be able to discharge this electricity into the ground.

Since the tire is the only point of contact between the vehicle and the ground, there is a regulation in this respect governing the minimum level of conductivity of tires.

When carbon black is used as reinforcement filler, tires normally have an acceptable level of conductivity.

When other reinforcement fillers are used, such as silica, the level of conductivity may decrease. It then becomes necessary to apply design artifaces to restore conductivity to an acceptable level.

Hence the "zebrure" on the tread: this is a fine slice of rubber, the conductivity of which is such that it will enable the vehicle to discharge its static electricity into the ground.

This unique visial feature on the tread is totally neutral as far as the performance of the tread is concerned (long service, live, grip, etc.).



January 31

Annette and I are off to Mexico for the month of February. We will be visiting areas in the Central Plateau that will be in large part new for us, making this an interesting and exciting trip. Travelling on our BMW R100RT motorcycle just adds a huge dimension to the trip, never having taken it out of the country before.

The trip starts in McAllen, Texas, with Annette and her sister Lois leaving for Santiago by bus. I left at 10:50, taking a somewhat different route, with the Bahia Escondida Hotel & Resort as our destination. We arrived about the same time mid-afternoon.

The bus ride by Annette and Lois was straightforward. My cycle trip down was enjoyable. The odometer turned 200 when I parked the Beemer around 4:30 P.M. Trip time about 5:40, not any great speed. About 80 miles were on the toll road, with the rest on roads like rural Wisconsin.

The toll road speed is 70 mph. The rest of the roads were 50 mph. Good roads. Since much of the trip was made in drizzle or otherwise on wet roads, the bike was dirtier than it has ever been. Its dirty coating is hard to wash.

Except for the lousy weather, things couldn't be much better. However, little English spoken in the area. We are nevertheless getting along famously.

February 1

We are settled in our comfortable condo, then walked about and taxied into town, the Villa de Santiago. After a good meal in Las Palomas, we were given a tour of the attached Hotel de Santiago Apostol.



The 300 year old church, Santiago Apostol (St James the Apostle), has buried inside, mostly under the floor, past priests and the wealthy. The Indians were all buried outside the church.

February 5

A tour group of 17 retired Canadians arrived Tuesday. We hitched a ride with them this morning when they toured the Horsetail Falls: the Cola de Caballo. The falls are spectacular. We would have gone on our own, but the road to the falls was reported to be in very bad shape.



February 6

We traveled about 170 miles south to Ciudad Victoria, the capital of the state of Tamaulipas. The highway was a bit better than many of our Wisconsin roads. Little traffic until we got to the city. Drove some in the heavy traffic and was glad to finally find a hotel. Took the first one we found—\$30 for a bare room: one light bulb, no table, no hot water as far as we can tell. We think that we are the only ones here. On the positive side, there is great cable TV, with many channels in English, including CNN.

We are enjoying walking the streets and Mexican life. People are very friendly. When walking about, we found half a dozen more hotels better than ours. Weather is good. Found an Internet shop that costs only \$.75/hour. You can imagine how that appeals to me.


